<u>Malicious</u> – characterized by malice; intending or intended to do harm.

**<u>Earnest</u>** – serious in intention, purpose, or effort; sincerely zealous:

<u>Pedestrian</u> - lacking inspiration or excitement; dull

<u>Pejorative</u> - expressing contempt or disapproval

**Pessimistic - tending** to see the worst aspect of things or believe that the worst will happen

<u>Callous</u> - showing or having an insensitive and cruel disregard for others

**Satiric** - relating to or constituting satire

<u>Inflammatory</u> - arousing or intended to arouse angry or violent feelings

<u>Admonish</u> – warn or reprimand someone firmly.

**<u>Beseeches</u>** – ask (someone) urgently and fervently to do something; implore; entreat;

Adjure - urge or request (someone) solemnly or earnestly to do something

**Insult** - disrespectful or scornfully abusive

**Attack** - to direct unfavorable criticism against; criticize severely; argue with strongly

**Assert** - to state a fact or belief confidently and forcefully

**Advise** - offer suggestions about the best course of action to someone.

**Expound** - to interpret, present, or explain (a theory or idea) systematically and in detail

<u>Assess</u> - evaluate or estimate the nature, ability, or quality of

**Regret -** sorrowful because of what is lost, gone, or done

<u>Ascertain</u> - to find out definitely; learn with certainty or assurance

**Advance** - to move forward, typically in a purposeful way
